Changes in this year's beer fest include moving it to a Saturday so we can open sooner and stay open longer, slightly higher admission prices (\$3 in advance & \$5 at the door), and running the kitchen as a separate project. The hours are from 3:00 - 10:00pm. We need volunteers to help with advance ticket sales and promotions. Attend any of the upcoming Peoria Jaycee events and talk with **Joe Burkitt**, **Jeff Pulfer**, Dennis or John to get tickets to sell or contact **Dan Schmidt** or Jeff Pulfer to get flyers and handbills to distribute.

It's A Little Known Fact... The King of Rock n Roll

Elvis Aron Presley was born on January 8, 1935 in Tupelo, Miss. In 1949, his family had moved to Memphis where he finished high school in 1953. Soon after, he met Sam Phillips, the president of Sun Record Company. He had went there to record a song for his mother. Elvis made his first commercial recording for Sun the following year, and Colonel Tom Parker, who managed his career from that time, arranged for him to make a series of personal appearances.

In 1955, RCA Victor purchased Elvis's recording contract with Phillips, and by 1956, Elvis was a best-selling recording artist and television star. His hip gyrations, which some viewers thought too suggestive (Elvis was only filmed on TV from the waist up), earned him the nickname Elvis the Pelvis. *Love Me Tender*, his first film was also released in 1956.

Elvis was drafted into the Army in 1958 and went through regular training and then served in Germany as a truck driver. He was discharged in 1960. He resumed his career under the management of Col. Parker, and worked up a touring act, based in Las Vegas.

Elvis bought Graceland, his lavish Memphis mansion, using it as a retreat from ecstatic fans. He married Priscilla Beaulieu in 1967 and had one daughter, Lisa Marie, the year after. Elvis and Priscilla were divorced in 1973. Elvis started to become a recluse, as he could not go in public without being mobbed by fans. He gained weight and started taking several prescription drugs. He died of heart failure in Memphis on August 16, 1977. However, his records continue to sell, and his legend has brought on a whole new generation of fans and imitators.
