Jaycees Prepare 35th Annual Haunted House

It was once a "Planet of Terror" and then "It Came From Peoria." It was called "Dark City" and then with Y2k, it was "The Beginning of the End." It was all an "Evolution of Terror" that somehow wound up becoming just a "Movie Monster Mayhem." However, this year a "Nightmare on Northmoor" is turning out to be the Peoria Jaycees 35th Annual Haunted House.



Preparations for this year's haunted event started in mid-September at the annual Haunted House Blowout Party. Since then work as progressed to open the house by Friday, October 14.

There are some changes in this year's Haunted House that will be a first in a long time, if ever. The house will be open to the public primarily on Friday and Saturday nights only, with exception of Halloween weekend; Oct 14-15, Oct 21-22, Oct 27-31. The times have been altered as well, with the house staying open to only 11:30pm as opposed to midnight. For the past few years, traffic through the house had been very light during this stretch of 30 minutes. It was then decided to close the house a half an hour sooner.

Kid's Day is set for Sunday, October 23 from 1 – 3pm. This event is a time set aside for the less scary side of the Haunted House, where lights are kept on and very little children can go through and Trick or Treat in the house. Volunteers are needed to not dress up so much to scare people and to hand out candy to kids who go through the house.

As always, help is still needed in all capacities at the Haunted House, from light to heavy duty, from nighttime help to daytime help and from construction work to monster work to ticket booth duty. **Linda Thomas** is heading up manpower and if you'd like to schedule a night or two to work, or another miscellaneous task, please give her an e-mail at penquin449@hotmail.com. Proceeds from this year's house will benefit the Peoria Jaycees as well as Camp New Hope and other local charitable causes. Executive Officer Descriptions

President - Responsible for monitoring all activities of the chapter. Must be organized and a good delegator. The president is responsible for the direction of the chapter, in which it is typically a leadership position and not a management position. Also, the president sets the agenda and runs board and membership meetings. The current president is Toby Quin.

Chapter Management VP - This can be the most difficult and important vice president position. This officer is responsible for the day-to-day needs of the chapter. Individual Development VP - Schedules and is responsible for all personal training activities. Supervises projects such as the time management, computer training, speak & write ups and other personal learning and training projects. Becky Ulrich is the current Individual Development Vice President.

State Director - Keeps chapter informed of district, regional and state Jaycee activities and organizes visits to other chapters. Jennifer Orange currently holds this position.

Secretary - Responsible for all correspondence to and from the chapter. Records and publishes the minutes of Board and Membership meetings to be available at membership meetings. The current secretary is Kriss Cochran.

It's A Little Known Fact Mars

Mars is getting brighter for the simple reason that it's getting closer. Earth and Mars have been converging for months and on Oct. 30th at 0319 Universal Time, the two worlds will be just 69 million kilometers apart—the closest approach of Mars and Earth for the next 13 years. The timing is practically perfect for Halloween. Millions of kids and their parents will be outdoors after dark trick-or-treating on Oct 31st. Mars will rise at sundown that night, bright enough to be seen even from urban-lit cities. Furthermore, purists insist, Mars isn't really red, it's pumpkin-colored. Could it get any better? Mars in 2005 is nicely placed for detailed, high-magnification viewing. Already backyard astronomers are seeing some extraordinary things—like the "purple haze." Winter is beginning at the Martian north pole, and icy-blue clouds are gathering there. The vast cloud bank is easily seen through 10-inch and larger telescopes. (1)

Mars is the fourth planet from the Sun and is commonly referred to as the Red Planet. The rocks, soil and sky have a red or pink hue. The distinct red color was observed by stargazers throughout history. Before space exploration, Mars was considered the best candidate for harboring extraterrestrial life. Astronomers thought they saw straight lines crisscrossing its surface. This led to the popular belief that irrigation canals on the planet had been constructed by intelligent beings. In 1938, when Orson Wells broadcasted a radio drama based on the science fiction classic *War of the Worlds* by H.G. Wells, enough people believed in the tale of invading Martians to cause a near panic.

The atmosphere of Mars is quite different from that of Earth. It is composed primarily of carbon dioxide with small amounts of other gases. The six most common components of the atmosphere are: Carbon Dioxide (CO₂): 95.32%; Nitrogen (N₂): 2.7%; Argon (Ar): 1.6%; Oxygen (O₂): 0.13%; Water (H₂O): 0.03%; Neon (Ne): 0.00025 %. The average recorded temperature on Mars is -63° C (-81° F) with a maximum temperature of 20° C (68° F) and a minimum of -140° C (-220° F). (2)
