The Peoria Jaycees chapter elections for the 2006 Board of Directors are scheduled to take place at the organization's November membership meeting on Thursday, November 17, 2005.

Unfortunately, there are no announced candidates as of yet. At the October membership meeting, the floor was open for members to declare candidacy for office. However, the floor went silent when candidate announcements were allowed. "I was extremely disappointed that there was not even one announcement," stated Peoria Jaycees president **Toby Quin**. Chairwoman of the Board **Roxy Baker** shared Quin's disillusionment. "We usually get one or two people announce for something," said Baker, "usually for ID (individual development) or Membership. Those offices are kinda popular."

In recent years, many officer positions were announced for in October, and sometimes even contested. In November 2000, the position of the 2001 Individual Development VP was contested by 4 different members. A run-off election needed to be held to narrow down the field. But since then, candidate announcements and the number of members stepping up for an officer position in the organization have slowly diminished.

It is still not too late to announce an intention to run for office. Any member in good standing and have the qualifications may do so anytime up until the November membership meeting. At the November membership meeting and time of the elections, if no candidate announcement had been previously made, an individual who wishes to run for office will need another member to nominate them, along with someone else to "second" the nomination, in order to become a candidate for office.

Serving on the Board of Directors is highly regarded as the best experience anyone can derive from Peoria Jaycees. It offers the greatest type of leadership training out of all the activities the organization sponsors. 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## President Quin Unveils Plan To Prevent Flu Pandemic

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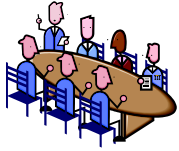

## Jaycee Member Still Believes But Has Doubts

Peoria, IL (Charge! News Wire) – “Oh look honey, it's Prancer!” says **Mary Brown** to her live-in boyfriend, **Brad Gordon**, as she looks out the window at a deer. Excitedly, Gordon races to the window to take a peek at one of Santa's fleet of reindeer. While Gordon says he still believes in Santa, he reports that he is beginning to have doubts about jolly ol' St. Nick. “That just looks like a plain deer that came out of the woods,” he responds, “the North Pole is a long way from here.”

“A lot of things just don't make any sense at all,” Gordon claims of his growing doubts about Santa Claus. He sites many things about Santa that cannot be explained, either physically or logically. “How can this bearded wonder go around the world and stop at most homes in only 24 hours? How can this fat guy fit down a chimney; and how am I getting presents Christmas morning when I don't even have a fireplace for him to come through?” Gordon questions. He continues, “And how do those reindeer fly? And don't get me started on the financial and business aspect of Santa's operation.” Gordon has also regularly questioned as to why no one ever sees Santa Claus and Peoria Jaycees associate member **Stan Munton** together in the same room.

Gordon's girlfriend Mary Brown tries to keep the belief and spirit going, but feels she is slowly losing the effort. “I guess Brad's a big boy now at 33 years old. Maybe it's time,” she said.

## It's A Little Known Fact Tryptophan

Tryptophan is an essential Amino Acid. It is a precursor for serotonin (which aids sleep and anxiety), and helps in niacin (B vitamins) production. Foods that are considered sources of tryptophan are dairy products, beef, poultry, barley, brown rice, fish, soybeans, and peanuts. L-tryptophan is a natural sedative. It is normally found in turkey meat, and many people believe it to be the cause of a sleepiness common after a Thanksgiving feast.

Tryptophan is a component of many plant and animal proteins, and a normal part of the diet that humans must get from outside sources. It also happens to be the precursor (starting material) from which our brains make serotonin, which calms you down and makes you sleepy. L-tryptophan was a very popular sleeping aid in the United States until recently, and was also used for premenstrual syndrome and depression. The FDA (Food and Drug Administration) removed it off the market in 1990 because of a sudden outbreak of eosinophilic-myalgia syndrome among people who had taken the supplement. About 5,000 people got sick and 27 died.

Sorry to say, that if you're looking for the sedative effect, it's unlikely you'll get it from eating meats like turkey. L-tryptophan doesn't act on the brain unless you take it on an empty stomach with no protein present. Additionally, the levels found in a turkey dinner are far too low to have such an effect. So, even though the mass media, CNN and Fox like to hype it and blame post holiday meal sleepiness on the turkey dinner... that's just a catchy sound-bite.. not the reality. The tryptophan isn't to blame for the sudden drowsiness that hits right after the meal when the football games come on, and the dishes are waiting! It's more likely due to the combination of drinking alcohol and overeating - not just turkey, but also mashed potatoes, ham, creamed onions, cranberries, sweet potatoes, peas, stuffing (or dressing, if you prefer), carrots, bread, pies, and whipped cream, (and HOW many beers did you have???) - all of which have the effect of pulling the blood away from your brain to help your digestive tract do it's work, and the sugar/insulin effect.
