Jaycees Prepare For Next Year's Santa Parade

Peoria, IL (Charge! News Wire) – The Peoria Jaycees once again formed their candy cane brigade and marched in the 118th Annual Peoria Santa Claus Parade this past November. However, attendance for the event seemed to have subsided and it was member **Randy Stevens** who noticed while watching the event on television. Inspiration had just hit; how can the Jaycees make its parade entry better Stevens asked himself. The answer: a complete, real float.

And then, the question came as to what the theme of the float would be. Stevens claims he didn't have to think about that one very long. "All Christmas is anymore is total commercialism," Stevens complained. His float idea was based off of the fast-becoming popular Festivus holiday. Essentially, the float would be decorated with a large metal or aluminum pole in the center of the float. On the front end of the float would be a loud PA system so the "airing of grievances" can be heard. On the back end of the float would be a display of the "feats of strength," with several Jaycee volunteers wrestling one another.

The Festivus holiday was made popular from the television series *Seinfeld*, where each December 23rd, a large pole is erected instead of a Christmas tree. There would be an "airing of grievances" where everyone would explain how everyone else disappointed that person. The "feats of strength" would follow, obviously to relieve the tension built. Festivus was mainly a protest to the vast commercialism Christmas has become.

"Christmas has nothing to do with Peace to all Mankind anymore," Stevens vehemently testified, "Christmas is about greedy corporations making more money." Stevens believes the Peoria Jaycees would be the first group to use the Festivus holiday as an entry theme for the longest continuous Santa parade.

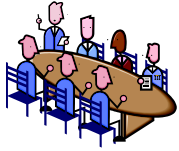

Jaycees To Promote All-Cheese Weekend

Peoria, IL (Charge! News Wire) – The Peoria Jaycees are organizing an event to promote what they consider to be America's favorite food, cheese. It's A Little Known Fact John Lennon

John Winston Lennon was born in Liverpool on the evening of October 9, 1940 during a period of much turmoil as the UK was heavily engaged in World War II. Both of his parents had musical backgrounds and experience, though neither pursued them seriously. Lennon lived with his parents in Liverpool until his father Alfred (nicknamed Alf, and later "Freddy"), a merchant seaman, walked out on the family when John was five years old. His mother, Julia, then decided that she was unable to care for her son, and so gave him to her sister Mimi. Lennon lived with Aunt Mimi and her husband George at Mendips, 251 Menlove Avenue, Liverpool throughout the rest of his childhood and adolescence. (1)

John Lennon met Paul McCartney on July 6, 1957 at the Woolton Parish Church Garden Fete in Liverpool. It was at this event that John's group, The Quarrymen, were playing. A mutual friend of John and Paul's, Ivan Vaughan, who also was a member of the group, introduced the two. Paul was impressed that John had a band; John was impressed Paul could tune a guitar. Paul auditioned that day by playing the Eddie Cochran song *Twenty Flight Rock* on John's guitar upside down (because Paul was left handed). Paul was soon asked to join the group and he and John would go on to write a vast array of songs... and the rest is history.

John Lennon was assassinated on December 8, 1980 by a disturbed fan, Mark David Chapman. Lennon and his wife, Yoko Ono, arrived at their New York City apartment from a recording session when Lennon was met by Chapman. With a .38 caliber revolver, Lennon was fatally shot 4 times. The doorman was able to wrestle the gun away from Chapman and had asked what he thought he was doing. Chapman replied "I shot John Lennon." He then took off his coat and got out a copy of the J.D. Salinger book, *The Catcher in the Rye* and began reading. When police arrived, Chapman was still reading. John Lennon died in route to the hospital where he was pronounced DOA. John Lennon was 40.
