## 13<sup>th</sup> Annual International Beer Festival

The Peoria Jaycees 13<sup>th</sup> Annual International Beer Festival will be held for the first time on two separate days. Starting Friday, March 11<sup>th</sup>, from 6 – 9pm, the event will be featured as a sneak preview, with only the first 750 people allowed entry at \$10 a person. Attendees will also receive a souvenir taste testing glass and a free BBQ sandwich from Q's Smokehouse. The main event of the IBF will be the next day on Saturday, March 12, 2005, from 1 – 9pm.



Of course, volunteers are always needed to bring this project to a successful end. Beer loading will take place on the evening of Thursday, March 10 at Specialty Imports on Washington St, downtown Peoria. Setup will begin 8:00am, Friday, March 11 and must be ready by 5:30pm. Volunteers from the Center for Prevention of Abuse are helping out Friday night. And of course, volunteers are needed during the main event on Saturday. Last, but not least, the clean up detail is needed late Saturday night and Sunday. It's not too late to get involved. ## Jaycees Concerned About English-only Speaking Members Might Hamper International Project

Peoria, IL (Charge! New Wire) – Top officials at the Peoria Jaycees have become alarmingly concerned over the fact that many of its members do not speak any foreign languages. "We have an international event coming up real soon, but no one in our organization can speak any language other than English," stated the chapter management vice president **Scott Ulrich**. The Peoria Jaycees International Beer Festival is scheduled for March 11 and 12, to which the Jaycees do not have any foreign speaking ambassadors. "This is very embarrassing," Ulrich added.

Ulrich claimed that there were a couple of members who could speak some phrases in German and Spanish. "Our previous president, **Roxy Baker** can speak fluent Pig Latin, and a lot of it, but we have no real interpreters here," Ulrich continued. The Jaycees hope that this is not a detriment to the long running beer tasting event.

Ulrich went on to say, "I guess as long as people are drinking beer and are happy, everyone can communicate just fine."

## It's A Little Known Fact Social Security

In 1933, an elderly California physician, Francis Townsend, proposed a scheme whereby the Federal government would provide every person over 60 a \$200 monthly pension. Townsend claimed that his Old Age Revolving Pension Plan could be financed by a Federal tax on commercial transactions. The plan obtained a great deal of public support and by 1935 his Townsend Club had over 5 million members. In 1935 Townsend handed in to President Franklin D. Roosevelt a petition supporting the Old Age Revolving Pension Plan that had been signed by over 20 million people. In response to the petition, Congress passed the Social Security Act on August 14, 1935. <sup>(1)</sup>

It established Old Age and Survivors' Insurance that provided for compulsory savings for wage earners so that benefits may be paid to them on retirement at 65. To finance the scheme, both the employer and employee had to pay a 3% payroll tax. The provisions of the act also encouraged states to deal with social problems. <sup>(1)</sup> As President Franklin D. Roosevelt stated in 1935, social security was to "frame a law which will give some measure of protection to the average citizen and to his family against the loss of a job and against poverty-ridden old age." <sup>(2)</sup>

Ida May Fuller was the first beneficiary of recurring monthly Social Security payments. Ms. Fuller filed her retirement claim on November 4, 1939, having worked under Social Security for a little short of 3 years. Social Security claims were grouped in batches of 1,000 and a Certification List for each batch was sent to the US Treasury. Ms. Fuller's claim was the first one on the certification List and so the first Social Security check, check number 00-000-001, was issued to Ida May Fuller in the amount of \$22.54, dated January 31, 1940. <sup>(3)</sup>

The first recorded applicant for a lump sum payment was Ernest Ackerman, who retired only one day after the Social Security program began. For his nickel put into Social Security, he received a lump sum payment of seventeen cents. <sup>(2)</sup>
