US Jaycees To Change Calendar Year

In a landslide vote at the US Jaycees National Convention in Las Vegas, NV, it was decided to change the Jaycee year from May 1st to April 30th to a regular calendar year of January 1st to December 31st. In effect, it will be expected, although not required, that state and local chapters follow suit. With the year change effective immediately, the US Jaycees would like to complete this transition by the year 2000.

Four methods of transition are currently available, ranging from cutting the current year to 6 months and ending this December, or extending the current year to December 1999. A consensus was taken at the July board meeting and was unanimous in accepting a policy of ending the current year this December and getting this change over and done with. In addition, all board members were displeased with the change in year, but felt it should be done so that the local chapter is in sync with the national organization and will be able to take advantage of several awards and programs.

With this change in calendar year, chapter elections will need to be moved to November, a time when members try to rest up after the Haunted House. The chapter's constitution and by-laws will need minor changes. Also, chapter books and administrative duties will need to be dosed in December, not to mention the Annual Year-End Awards and Installation Banquet to be held during the busy holiday season. Chairman of the Board, '**Governor**' **Dennis Owens** summed it up best when he stated, "It's one big sandwich and we all have to take a bite!"

The Big Bang Has Bung

The Peoria Jaycees held their 16th Annual Firecracker 5000 on Saturday, July 4, 1998 in downtown Peoria with an estimated 548 entrants. The event is a 5 kilometer/3.1 mile footrace with the proceeds benefiting **Big Brothers/Big Sisters**. With a morning of beautiful weather, this year's race featured a new route that took runners and walkers up Adams Street and back down the newly developed Pimeteoui Trail. The previous race route forced the racers to run uphill during the first half mile. The race starts and finishes at the RiverStation restaurant.

Mike Buckley and **Kevin Leach** chaired this year's event and it was the first major project they have chaired. Jaycees Calendar Year Change

If the Peoria Jaycees should switch to this new year, chapter elections will have to be moved to November, chapter books would have to be closed during the holiday season and the chapter plan and budget will need to be drafted at the beginning of the year during DSA Banquet planning.

After a lengthy discussion at the July board meeting, the executive board reluctantly voted to change the chapter's calendar year so that the chapter could be in sync with the national, state and other Jaycee chapters. This will now be voted on at the July membership meeting. Upon chapter approval of this matter, certain by-law changes will need to be made in the chapter's constitution. These by-law changes will be presented and voted upon at the August membership meeting on August 20, 1998.

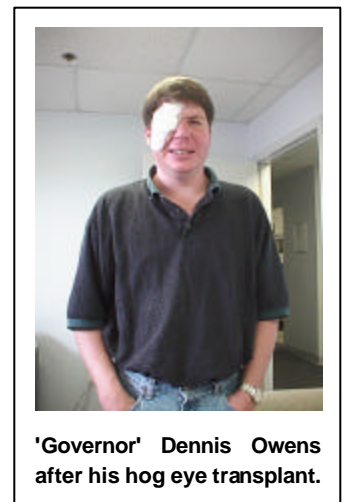
'Governor' Owens Undergoes Experimental Eye Surgery

During work on a recent construction project, **'Governor' Dennis Owens** became the victim of a freak accident. It's A Little Known Fact Hawaii

The Hawaiian Islands were originally settled by **Polynesian** immigrants more than 1000 years ago but probably remained unknown beyond Polynesia until Captain **James Cook** reached the islands in 1778. In 1796 King **Kamehameha I** united the islands into a single independent kingdom. In 1893 the Hawaiian monarch was deposed and Hawaii became successively a republic in 1894, a U.S. possession in 1898, and a U.S. territory in 1900.
