East Peoria, IL (Charge! News Wire) - 'Jaycee Racing' drove away with the 1st Place Championship trophy at the Annual Arthritis Foundation Mini Grand Prix. The fundraising event was held at Folepi's Marketplace in East Peoria on Saturday, July 25th. Team leader **Dan 'the Friar' Schmidt** claimed that the racers were in excellent form that day. Help Wanted: A Good Printer

You might have noticed that last month's newsletter had a little better print quality. This is because it was printed at Pip Printing rather than the old rickety photocopier at the RLO World H.Q. Jeff 'Mad Dog' Bilsland and I have been researching different

printers to perform the task of printing and folding every month's issue of *The Charge!*

Pip Printing gave us a good deal and sounded like they were professional enough to handle a job such as this. However, we learned different. To begin with, they offered to print bar coding for bulk mail postage onto the newsletter and claimed it would save us roughly \$30 in postage. Of course they would do this for a price of \$50. But we accepted knowing that this would be a more efficient means of mailing.

Meanwhile, 'Mad Dog' was foaming at the mouth with their main administrative office in setting up credit and billing. We had hoped to bring them the newsletter every month for printing and then they could bill us. However, the woman who handles this type of business at Pip could not comprehend a volunteer organization with no physical location or office. Our address of a PO box was not acceptable and the address of a member's residence did not constitute as an actual business office of the organization. In the end, we were unable to do any business with Pip in this regard.

After 2 or 3 days (it takes me 1 day to print, fold and mail), the newsletter was finally mailed. Once in our mailboxes, we discovered that no bar coding was used. Instead, labels were made and applied onto the newsletter; a process we already used. After paying Pip \$50 for this service, we did not save one dime on postage. We soon were under the impression that Pip is not running a tight ship.

We have now learned of another printing company and we are currently negotiating with them for the printing and folding job. Their prices are little under what Pip's were and they sound positive. But we'll know soon enough.

It's A Little Known Fact Baseball

Baseball is one of the oldest and most popular spectator sports. The game as it is known today developed during the early 1800s among children and amateur players. Today, professional baseball attracts millions of spectators to ballparks each year and entertains millions more through radio and television broadcasts.

Although it is clear that modern baseball developed in North America, the exact origin of the game is difficult to determine. Most scholars believe that baseball evolved from a variety of similar games that have been played for centuries. A popular legend claims that Abner Doubleday, who was a Union officer during the American Civil War (1861-1865), invented baseball in Cooperstown, New York, in 1839. But there is little support for this story.

There is evidence that people played games involving a stick and a ball since the early days of civilization. Ancient cultures in Persia, Egypt and Greece played stick-and-ball games for recreation and as part of certain ceremonies. Europeans brought stick-and-ball games to the American colonies as early as the 1600s. Through the 1700s, however, they were widely considered children's games. By the early 1800s, a variety of stick-and-ball games had become popular in North America. Most of these games originated in England. Many people in northeastern cities such as Boston, New York and Philadelphia played **cricket**, a traditional game of English aristocrats.
